Spring 2009 IMT600 Independent Study Proposal – Peter Ellis

Abstract/General Description:

This independent study is the continuation of my independent study from Winter quarter, in which I wrote two substantive research papers on the intersection between environmental sustainability and information management. This quarter builds on that work by providing more space for revising and publishing that work while also contributing substantively to two new papers – one focusing on the Global Textbook Project and environmental sustainability and another book review. I intend for this independent study to end with the submission of the bulk of these papers to academic journals.

- Make substantive contributions to the academic literature on green IT, sustainability, and information management.

- At least three papers submitted for academic publication.
- A book review of one of the textbooks listed above.

Credit/no credit will be based on faculty's assessment of the quality of the student's writing; specifically, the preparation of top-tier material ready for academic publication.
